

The Historic Auditorium

St Croix Falls ~ Wisconsin

A Testament to Building Community

After years of being in limbo, the early months of 2023 saw a stalled project move into action as two men, having known this building since they were very young, asked themselves, "What if WE took the project to the finish line?"

Brothers-in-law, Rick Vezina and Jeff Virchow, brought together their combined talents and experiences for what became a labor of love. "This had to get done," said Jeff in March of 2023, as a small group of stewards toured the building. Yet, the story doesn't start there. It starts, like all lasting stories, at the beginning.

In 1915, when St. Croix Falls was still a young municipality, a combination of elected officials and town boosters set into motion a civic project that would provide social space at the street level and a performance hall upstairs. Imagine the excitement this project brought to a village less than thirty years old, where Wisconsin's first State Park had been designated, and a hydroelectric dam project recently completed. All this was within a downtown where commerce was rapidly expanding. What a thrill it must have been to watch the Auditorium added to the treasures of St. Croix Falls!

Not long after the Auditorium's opening, two historychanging events had a profound impact on the building and community: the emergence of the silent movie industry and the combination of World War I and the Spanish Flu. First, the Historic Auditorium's community social space, having barely been in service, was repurposed as a Red Cross Hospital to support the war effort and respond to the pandemic. Then, as the war and flu epidemic ended, the performance hall was repurposed by R.O. Pepper to become a movie theater, which it stayed until 1985. All historic buildings face opportunities for modernization, and the municipally-owned Auditorium received many waves of upgrades over the years as the lower level changed hands (it remained a community center until the 1950s and then a sewing factory, city offices, and library). The upper level adapted to decades of innovation in the movie industry. In 1961, a street-front lobby addition was added to the Auditorium that would better serve the thriving business managed by the Pepper Family's enterprise.

The performance hall was vacated in 1985 and went unused until the spring of 1989 when a local community theatre troupe stepped in to clean seats, refinish the floor, and prepare the space for the renewed use of its original purpose: live theater. One year later, a new professional theater company added summer stock programming to the mix and that marked the birth of St. Croix Festival Theatre.

By 1994, the City of St. Croix Falls, along with the municipal library and Festival Theatre, began planning for the future of the building, which included removal of the 1961 addition, and securing a place on the State and National Registers of Historic Places. Robust planning efforts took place from 2007 to 2016, including essential contributions by the Living Landmark Committee. Ready to go out to bid in the fall of 2016, the rehabilitation project was derailed several times. Which returns THIS story to today.

Those two men referenced at the start of this article worked tirelessly to remove years of "improvements," from paneling and acoustic ceiling panels to obsolete mechanical infrastructure and century-old fixtures. Rick Vezina used his talents and expertise as President of Lift Bridge Builders to mobilize the construction efforts and brother-in-law Jeff Virchow used his talents and expertise in management to hold the redevelopment project to a high standard of collaborative success. The Historic Auditorium has entirely new heating, cooling, and ventilation, and all new electrical service and fire suppression systems. It finally has a long-awaited elevator and restrooms at all levels. Fresh coats of paint on the inside and stucco outside are all part of welcoming audiences back to a building that has served the community and visitors well since 1916!

In purchasing the building and moving the Historic Auditorium project forward, Rick and Jeff have brought this beloved building back to a careful version of what it was in the beginning, including the meticulous restoration of windows that had not been allowed to let in the beautiful St. Croix Valley light since 1927.







Favorite spots for Birding, Wildlife Watching, Hiking & Camping

MINNESOTA

Afton State Park - Afton, MN ~ Grand oaks and delicate prairie flowers grace the rugged, rolling landscape of this park. Wind your way down deep ravines and rise up to the grassy ridgetops and bluffs overlooking the scenic St. Croix River. The trails are perfect for hikers, horseback riders and cross-country skiers, in the winter.

William O'Brien State Park - Marine on St. Croix, MN A great "get away" park only one hour from the Twin Cities. Hiking trails offer quiet exploration of the Park's rolling, wooded hills. For anglers, the channels of the St. Croix have northerns, walleye, bass and trout. Ideal for canoeing, the river is also a migratory pathway that offers visitors an exciting diversity of sights and sounds.

Wild River State Park - Center City, MN ~ Located along 18 miles of the beautiful St. Croix River. The park attracts people who enjoy camping, hiking, horseback riding, canoeing, interpretive programs, self-guided trails, cross-country skiing and snowshoeing.

Carpenter St. Croix Valley Nature Center - MN & WI Located along the bluffs of the Wild & Scenic St. Croix River, 425 acres of tall grass prairie, oak savannah, flood plain, pine plantation, wetland and woodland. Hike or stroll 4 miles of paved trails and 11 miles of mulched trails. Birders will find perfect viewing of fall raptor migration.

Interstate Park - Taylors Falls, MN & St. Croix Falls, WI Visitors can climb the cliffs of the St. Croix River Dalles, canoe the flat-water, or kayakers' can rush through the rapids. Spring brings a great diversity of wildflowers; in fall the St. Croix River Valley forest is ablaze in autumn colors of red, gold, and orange.

WISCONSIN

Willow River State Park - Hudson, WI ~ Multiple Habitats, Multiple Seasons. At 2,891 acres, Willow River State Park has a variety of habitats to explore, prairie, forests and panoramic river scenery. Avid birders will glimpse Eastern and Western Meadowlarks, Bobolinks and Sedge Wrens in the prairies. The most popular hiking trail destinations are the Willow Falls and the scenic overlooks of the river valley.

Kinnickinnic State Park - River Falls, WI ~ Wildlife watchers in Kinnickinnic State Park can observe a wide variety of birds and animals in their natural environments. The gorge and delta are designated as a state natural area. The valley of the Kinnickinnic River, a cold water trout stream, is a rare sanctuary with majestic white pines and sheer limestone cliffs.

Freedom Park Visitor & Learning Center - Prescott, WI Located at the northern gateway to Wisconsin's Great River Road, a National Scenic Byway, the Center overlooks the scenic upper Mississippi River Valley where the St. Croix River enters the mighty Mississippi. Enjoy the educational native plant gardens, and look for raptors, migrating birds and other wildlife at this Audubon Birding site and Watchable Wildlife site.



ST. CROIX COUNTY PARKS

Homestead Parklands on Perch Lake – Hudson, WI ~ Scuba Divers Paradise. Homestead Parklands is on the northern 2/3 of Perch Lake, which is the central feature of the park. The land area includes steep slopes covered by oak woodlands and pine stands, a beautiful flowering prairie, 6,800 feet of shoreline along pristine Perch Lake, and the best beach in St. Croix County. Please see the parks grid for a full list of park amenities.

Orf Family Overlook on Bass Lake – Hudson, WI ~ Orf Family Overlook on Bass Lake is adjacent to the Bass Lake Boat Launch. The 15-acre park includes hiking trails, a picnic shelter, a scenic overlook, boardwalk, and a viewing platform perfect for bird watching.

Glen Hills Park on Glen Lake - Glenwood City, WI ~ Camping in all seasons. Glen Hills Park is a water-based recreation facility located in the hill country of West Central Wisconsin. This park consists of 700 wooded acres surrounding the beautiful 78-acre Glen Lake. There are 88 electric, non-electric, RV, and tent campsites, and two all season camper cabins available throughout the park. Please see the parks grid for a full list of park amenities.

Troy Beach on the St. Croix – Hudson, WI ~ Relaxation central! Troy Beach is a five-acre day use park on the beautiful St. Croix River, a national scenic riverway. The 400-foot beach is a popular destination for those looking to beat the summer heat under the shade of large cottonwood trees or to relax and watch the sail boats on the St. Croix.

Eckert Blufflands on the St. Croix – Hudson, WI ~ The new Eckert Blufflands County Park, along the St. Croix River just north of Hudson, consists of 170 acres of wooded upland, deep ravines, prairie restoration, over 100-foot-high river bluffs, and more than half a mile of river shoreline. (Currently under development.)

St. Croix River Crossing Loop Trail – Houlton, WI ~ The Loop Trail is in Northwestern St. Croix County, approximately seven miles north of Hudson and eight miles southwest of Somerset. The Loop Trail is part of an interstate trail between Houlton, Wisconsin and Stillwater, Minnesota. The 4.7-mile trail is open to pedestrians and bicycles and crosses both the St Croix Crossing Bridge and the historic Stillwater Lift Bridge.



The Ice Age National Scenic Trail, WI





Cast Your Cares Away

Clean water and a wide variety of underwater habitats make the waters of the **St. Croix National Scenic Riverway** support one of the best fisheries in the Upper Midwest. There have been more than 60 species of fish documented from the St. Croix River. The St. Croix Valley's pan fish season never closes, and Walleye, Northern Pike, and other seasons extend deep into winter. As a result, fishing continues to be one of the St. Croix Valley's most popular outdoor activities even long after the rivers and lakes have turned to ice. One of the most famous designated trout streams in the St. Croix Valley, the **Kinnickinnic River**, is one of the few naturally sustaining trout fisheries in the Midwest; the 22-mile spring fed river in St. Croix County produces both brook and brown trout.


Barn Quilt Trail

Barns, Quilts and Road Trips

If you are looking for something unique to do on a beautiful day, check out the Chisago Lakes Barn Quilt Trail. No matter what time of year, a journey through the Chisago Lakes Barn Quilt Trail offers a beautiful experience and exquisite scenery. Each of the cities along the Trail has its own personality, with a variety of things to do that will enhance your exploration of barn quilts. From Interstate Park in Taylors Falls to the famous Coffee Pot Water Tower in Lindström, your road trip from quilt to quilt will leave you with wonderful memories.

What is a Barn Quilt? Within many cultures, the humble quilt has represented hard work, individuality, warmth, and resourcefulness. Quilts tell the story of our indigenous peoples, immigrants and pioneers. Created as a representation of these iconic art forms, barn quilts are quilt block patterns, colorfully painted on wood squares of varying sizes. These squares started appearing on farmstead barns more than 100 years ago, and many farms were known by their unique quilt pattern.





Set along the rugged and colorful scenery of the Mississippi, St. Croix and Vermillion rivers, Hastings is a scenic river town steeped in tradition. Just 25 miles (40km) south of the Twin Cities, Hastings welcomes visitors to share in its history and traditions. The City is renowned for Victorian architecture with over 60 buildings listed on the National Register of Historic Places. A must see is the LeDuc Historic Estate—a beautiful Gothic Revival mansion, open for tours mid-May through October.

The Great Outdoors

If you're a fan of the great outdoors, you can enjoy more than **30 miles** of paved bike and walking trails along the Mississippi River and other scenic byways; picnic by Vermillion Falls or explore beautiful nearby **Carpenter St. Croix Valley Nature Center**. Spend the day fishing on the Mississippi or St. Croix Rivers, play golf at one of several local courses, take in a free outdoor Sunday concert, visit the Mississippi Lock & Dam #2 or just relax by the banks of the river.

Hastings is home to two amazing vineyards/wineries; the **Alexis Bailly Vineyard and the Lone Oak Vineyard & Winery**. Both have award-winning wines to sample and purchase while you walk about the vineyards. If your palette is looking for a home brew or seltzer, **Spiral Brewery** is located in Historic Downtown Hastings. With its family-friendly taproom all ages are welcome, even well-behaved leashed pups. Stop in, sample a few and take your favorite home in a growler or two.



For winter adventure, ski, snowboard, or tube the slopes at Welch Village or Afton Alps ski areas. Check out Spring Lake Park and Afton State Park for beautiful groomed cross country ski trails.

Year-Round Festivals

Spring and summer bring fun-filled events for visitors to enjoy. From May through September take in the **Historic Hastings Car Shows**. In July, thousands of people come to enjoy **Rivertown Days**, a community wide festival featuring music stages, arts and craft fair, carnival and a car show. Also in July, step back in time with the **Little Log House Antique Power Show & Pioneer Village**. October brings the **Saint Croix Valley Apple Fest** with a variety of fun events for all ages at area apple orchards.



Prescott is a quaint, picturesque river town, located where the blue waters of the scenic St. Croix River meet the mighty Mississippi River. Most downtown businesses occupy buildings from the 19th century, giving the community its historic flavor.

On the bluff above Prescott is **The Great River Road Visitor** and Learning Center at Freedom Park offering visitors the opportunity to learn about the Mississippi and St. Croix Rivers, to watch bald eagles soaring and experience the views of the river valley.



At the Heart of Prescott

Shoppers, boaters, bikers and cyclists are drawn to Prescott's historic Broad Street. Unique, award winning restaurants and bars with beautiful outdoor patios and scenic views are enjoyed by those with a discriminating palate. Antiques, home décor, gift shops, art galleries, and historic, beautiful building murals add to the charm of one of Wisconsin's earliest river towns.

For visitors with a passion for architecture, a self-guided tour of Prescott will take you to 41 locations, including the original town square with three historic church buildings still standing. The tour also includes several 1850's and 1860's Greek revival homes in the bluff top residential area of Prescott.



The Welcome and Heritage Center, located in downtown Prescott is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Built in 1855 as a bank, it now serves as the Area Historical Society.

Riverfront Recreation & Leisure

A four – block river walkway extends along Prescott's riverfront area, and includes **Mercord Mill Park**, overlooking the confluence of the St. Croix and Mississippi rivers. You will enjoy strolling the river walkway along the levee and watching the barges, boats, canoes or kayaks moving up and downstream.



Rent a boat or pontoon and experience the two great rivers yourself. Enjoy fishing or a relaxing pleasure cruise. You might even

catch the lift bridge rise to accommodate sailboat masts, or see freight trains rumble across the distinctive iron bridge between Minnesota and Wisconsin.

A Well-Rounded Community No Matter the Season

Summer weekends you can find live music, art festivals, gallery exhibits, and amateur baseball from the Prescott Pirates or plan a relaxing day at the beach. In the winter, Prescott is an entrance point for 200 miles of well-maintained Pierce County snowmobile trails. Cross-country and downhill skiing are available at nearby area ski resorts and parks. The winter "village" of ice houses is a popular fishing tradition on the St. Croix River at Prescott. Not to mention the ice-sculpture garden or giant Christmas trees on display throughout town.

Surrounded by rolling hills and many beautiful lakes, Scandia is the site of the first Swedish settlement in Minnesota.

Rich with History

Visitors to Scandia often stop and view the Swedish Monument marking the location of the first log cabin built in 1850 and tour the Hay Lake School Museum before heading up the road to **Gammelgården Museum of Scandia.**

Gammelgården Museum of Scandia was established in 1972 to preserve, present and promote Swedish immigrant heritage. Gammelgarden, meaning "old small farm" in Swedish, is an open-air museum featuring historic buildings dating back to the 1850s. Join us on a guided tour to catch a glimpse into the daily lives of early immigrants to Minnesota through a Swedish lens. Signature Events through the year include Midsommar Dag, Spelmansstämman(Swedish Fiddle Festival) and Luciadagen.

Keep an eye out for **barn quilts** and **Dala** horses as you make your way through Scandia. To learn more about the 22 historical sites within the village center and greater Scandia, pick up a copy of the **Scandia Heritage Trail brochure**, from our museums and local shops. Scandia's unique shops located in historical buildings, invite you to browse a delightful selection of local art, pottery, edibles, and artisan gifts. Come join us on the 3rd Thursday of October, November, or December to enjoy **Scandia Evening Adventures** hosted by the local shops, serving special libation and activities to all that come. The Sunday following Thanksgiving don't miss **VinterLights!**, the celebration of winter, and enjoy carols, cocoa, cookies and the tree lighting.

Gammelgården Museum of Scandia

Grab your birding guide and binoculars to look for hundreds of avian species throughout the year in this globally important birding area of the Upper Mississippi River Valley. The bluff lands and river habitat of Lake Pepin provide a year-round home to song birds and raptors and the majestic American bald eagle. Migratory birds such as white pelicans, green herons, tundra swans and osprey make semi-annual stops in the Lake Pepin Area.

Cast Your Line

Lake Pepin is a popular fishery that is home to 85 species of fish including – Walleye, Northern Pike, Sauger, Smallmouth Bass, Crappie, Perch and Sunfish. Launch your boat from Pepin's public ramp and head for deep water, rocky shorelines, or weed cover to bag your catch. The launch area features a fully equipped fish cleaning station and public restrooms.



Bringing History to Life

Explore history by visiting the birthplace of beloved children's author, **Laura Ingalls Wilder**. Wilder was born in a small log cabin just 7 miles north of the Village. Visit a reconstruction of the original Cabin where her early childhood adventures became the basis of her book, "Little House in the Big Woods". Make sure to stop by the **Laura Ingalls Wilder Museum**, dedicated to preserving Laura's legacy.





Polk County is filled with charming towns and villages surrounded by picturesque farms, lakes, streams and the National Wild and Scenic Riverway. A few of the visitor favorite Polk County communities are Balsam Lake, Clear Lake, Turtle Lake, St. Croix Falls and

Amery. The Village of Balsam Lake rests on the southwest shore of Balsam Lake and is one of the most popular tourist destinations in northwest Wisconsin. Whether you are looking to relax or take advantage of activities both on and off shore, you will love Balsam Lake. Clear Lake is named for the lake that lies a ½ mile from town. The water in the lake is fed by living springs, which makes for excellent fishing and swimming. Turtle Lake is home to the St. Croix Band of the Chippewa Indians. You won't want to miss the annual **Pow -Wow** in late June. Turtle Lake is also home to the **Turtle Lake Casino**. Amery is nestled on an isthmus between the Apple River and the three lakes of – Pike, North Twin and South Twin. Spend time exploring Interstate Park, the oldest state park in Wisconsin, Straight Lake State Park and Wildlife Area, just 12 miles northeast of St. Croix Falls, or the 14 mile Stower Seven Lakes Trail. The Ice Age Trail is one of only 11 National Scenic Trails located entirely within Wisconsin. It is a premier hiking trail and conservation resource for silent sport and outdoor enthusiasts. The 98 mile Gandy Dancer State Recreation Trail follows the old Minneapolis-St. Paul and Sault Ste. Marie railroad grade, from St. Croix Falls to Superior, WI. In Polk County, the trail passes through Centuria, Milltown, Luck, Frederic and Lewis, WI. The short distances between these quaint towns makes the Gandy Dancer the most user friendly trail in the Midwest with easy access to local restaurants, lodging, parking and other local scenic trails and parks.
