



Located on the St. Croix River, between the cities of Afton and Stillwater, Bayport is known for its scenic charm and warm, small town hospitality. Whether you are a nature lover, recreation enthusiast, or a foodie in search of a great new place to eat, Bayport provides visitors with a variety of ways to enjoy the river valley!

Natural Beauty

At the south end of the city, photographers and birders come to enjoy the **St. Croix Savanna Scientific and Natural Area (SNA)**. This area is considered to be the best hill prairie and oak savannas along the Lower St. Croix National Scenic Riverway. In addition to stunning views of the river valley that span this 148 acres of open space, the SNA offers high bird diversity, with 115 bird species sighted and several varieties of native vegetation. Hiking trails can also be found throughout the SNA.

Waterfront Amenities

Visitors looking to explore the St. Croix River Valley by water will be pleased to know that Bayport offers multiple boat launches,



boat rental, transient boat slips, and gas dock at the area marinas. Lakeside Park, located on the shores of the St. Croix River, is also a valued community asset and the perfect destination to take a swim, have a picnic, or take a leisurely stroll along the river's shore.

Dining and Hospitality

Bayport offers a variety of unique, independent restaurant and dining options, which definitely enhance the character and charm of this historic town. Homestyle diner breakfast, scratch made Italian pasta, acclaimed French bistro style cuisine and oyster bar, exceptional sandwiches and burgers, and old-fashioned ice cream are just a few of the selections that aim to please. Visitors will find that the restaurants are easy to access off of the St. Croix Scenic Byway (Highway 95) and offer ample, free parking.

Scenic Rivertown

Renowned for its Historic Buildings

Set along the rugged and colorful scenery of the Mississippi, St. Croix and Vermillion rivers, Hastings is a scenic river town steeped in tradition. Just 25 miles (40km) south of the Twin Cities, Hastings welcomes visitors to share in its history and traditions. The City is renowned for Victorian architecture with over 60 buildings listed on the National Register of Historic Places. A must see is the LeDuc Historic Estate—a beautiful Gothic Revival mansion, open for tours mid-May through October.

The Great Outdoors

If you're a fan of the great outdoors, you can enjoy more than **30 miles** of paved bike and walking trails along the Mississippi River and other scenic byways; picnic by Vermillion Falls or explore beautiful nearby **Carpenter St. Croix Valley Nature Center**. Spend the day fishing on the Mississippi or St. Croix Rivers, play golf at one of several local courses, take in a free outdoor Sunday concert, visit the Mississippi Lock & Dam #2 or just relax by the banks of the river.



Surrounded by rolling hills and many beautiful lakes, Scandia is the site of the first Swedish settlement in Minnesota.

Rich with History

Visitors to Scandia often stop and view the Swedish Monument marking the location of the first log cabin built in 1850 and tour the Hay Lake School Museum before heading up the road to **Gammelgården Museum of Scandia**.

Gammelgården Museum of Scandia was established in 1972 to preserve, present and promote Swedish immigrant heritage. Gammelgården, meaning “old small farm” in Swedish, is an open-air museum featuring historic buildings dating back to the 1850s. Join us on a **guided tour** to catch a glimpse into the daily lives of early immigrants to Minnesota through a Swedish lens. Signature Events through the year include **Midsommar Dag**, **Spelmannsstämman** (Swedish Fiddle Festival) and **Luciadagen**.

Keep an eye out for **barn quilts** and **Dala horses** as you make your way through Scandia. To learn more about the 22 historical sites within the village center and greater Scandia, pick up a copy of the **Scandia Heritage Trail brochure**, from our museums and local shops. Scandia's unique shops located in historical buildings, invite you to browse a delightful selection of local art, pottery, edibles, and artisan gifts.

The park opened in 2008 & includes a boat launch, swimming beach, picnic areas, a large creative playground, hiking trails and a visitor's welcome office. Future park plans include family

and group camping and several additional miles of hiking and biking trails. A Washington County vehicle permit is required to enter the park. The cost is \$7 for a daily permit and \$30 for an annual vehicle permit.

Hay Lake School Museum & The Johannes Erickson Log

House • 14020 195th Street North • Constructed in 1896, the Hay



Lake School was used by Washington County Rural School system until 1963. The school was placed on the National Register of Historic Places on July 1, 1970. The log house was

constructed in 1868 by Johannes Erickson and his thirteen year old son Alfred. The Washington County Historical Society now operates both buildings as museums that demonstrate the early history of settlers in Scandia and Washington County.

Scandia Veterans Memorial Lilleskogen Park, Scandia, MN

"In honor of the generations of men and women who have served to defend the liberties that we enjoy today". The memorial is dedicated to all US military veterans, regardless of where they are from or



when they served. The memorial recognizes the contributions and sacrifices by generations of men and women who have served in battle or not, to defend our freedoms. The memorial is appropriately located in beautiful Lilleskogen Park. We hope you will come often to enjoy the memorial park.

Community Center Playground and Pickleball & Tennis Courts

Bring the kids and a picnic to Scandia's new community center playground, tennis and pickleball courts. Your go-to spot for all things fun. Washington County Barn Quilt Trail

Recognized by Travel Wisconsin as one of the state's top five trout streams, this pristine, 22-mile, spring-fed river is a Class I trout stream and one of the Midwest's few naturally sustaining fisheries, boasting an astonishing 8,000+ trout per mile in some sections.

Casting for its abundant brook and brown trout is just the beginning. The Kinni's 174-square-mile watershed is home to

more than 50% of the bird species and 40% of the plant species found in Wisconsin. It contains more than 40 species of endangered, threatened, or special concern plants, animals, and insects.

Whether you book a kayak rental to paddle its scenic waters or secure a fishing charter for a world-class angling adventure, the Kinni offers an unforgettable outdoor experience deep in the heart of nature.

MINNESOTA

Afton State Park - Afton, MN ~ Grand oaks and delicate prairie flowers grace the rugged, rolling landscape of this park. Wind your way down deep ravines and rise up to the grassy ridgelines and bluffs overlooking the scenic St. Croix River. The trails are perfect for hikers, horseback riders and cross-country skiers, in the winter.

William O'Brien State Park - Marine on St. Croix, MN

A great “get away” park only one hour from the Twin Cities. Hiking trails offer quiet exploration of the Park’s rolling, wooded hills. For anglers, the channels of the St. Croix have northerns, walleye, bass and trout. Ideal for canoeing, the river is also a migratory pathway that offers visitors an exciting diversity of sights and sounds.

Wild River State Park - Center City, MN ~ Located along 18 miles of the beautiful St. Croix River. The park attracts people who enjoy camping, hiking, horseback riding, canoeing, interpretive programs, self-guided trails, cross-country skiing and snowshoeing.

Interstate State Parks - Taylors Falls, MN & St. Croix Falls, WI Visitors can climb the cliffs of the St. Croix River Dalles, canoe the flat-water, or kayakers’ can rush through the rapids. Spring brings a great diversity of wildflowers; in fall the St. Croix River Valley forest is ablaze in autumn colors of red, gold, and orange.

WISCONSIN

Willow River State Park - Hudson, WI ~ Multiple Habitats, Multiple Seasons. At 2,891 acres, Willow River State Park has a variety of habitats to explore including prairie, forests and panoramic river scenery. Avid birders will glimpse Eastern and Western Meadowlarks, Bobolinks and Sedge Wrens in the prairies. The most popular hiking trail destinations are the Willow Falls and the scenic overlooks of the river valley.

Kinnickinnic State Park - River Falls, WI ~ Wildlife watchers in Kinnickinnic State Park can observe a wide variety of birds and animals in their natural environments. The gorge and delta are designated as a state natural area. The valley of the Kinnickinnic River, a cold water trout stream, is a rare sanctuary with majestic white pines and sheer limestone cliffs.

NATURE PRESERVES

Carpenter St. Croix Valley Nature Center - MN & WI Located along the bluffs of the Wild & Scenic St. Croix River, 425 acres of tall grass prairie, oak savannah, flood plain, pine plantation, wetland and woodland. Hike or stroll 4 miles of paved trails and 11 miles of mulched trails. Birders will find perfect viewing of fall raptor migration.

Freedom Park Visitor & Learning Center - Prescott, WI

Located at the northern gateway to Wisconsin’s Great River Road, a National Scenic Byway, the Center overlooks the scenic upper Mississippi River Valley where the St. Croix River enters the mighty Mississippi. Enjoy the educational native plant gardens, and look for raptors, migrating birds and other wildlife at this Audubon Birding site and Watchable Wildlife site.

ST. CROIX COUNTY PARKS

Homestead Parklands on Perch Lake - Hudson, WI ~ Scuba Divers Paradise. Homestead Parklands is on the northern 2/3 of Perch Lake, which is the central feature of the park. The land area includes steep slopes covered by oak woodlands and pine stands, a beautiful flowering prairie, 6,800 feet of shoreline along pristine Perch Lake, and the best beach in St. Croix County. Please see the parks grid for a full list of park amenities.

Orf Family Overlook on Bass Lake - Hudson, WI ~ Orf Family Overlook on Bass Lake is adjacent to the Bass Lake Boat Launch. The 15-acre park includes hiking trails, a picnic shelter, a scenic overlook, boardwalk, and a viewing platform perfect for bird watching.

Glen Hills Park on Glen Lake - Glenwood City, WI ~ Camping in all seasons. Glen Hills Park is a water-based recreation facility located in the hill country of West Central Wisconsin. This park consists of 700 wooded acres surrounding beautiful 78-acre Glen Lake. There are 92 electric, non-electric, RV, and tent campsites, and two all season camper cabins available in the park. Please see the parks grid for a full list of park amenities.

Troy Beach on the St. Croix - Hudson, WI ~ Relaxation central! Troy Beach is a five-acre day use park on the beautiful St. Croix River, a national scenic riverway. The 400-foot beach is a popular destination for those looking to beat the summer heat under the shade of large cottonwood trees or to relax in our new hammock village and watch the sail boats on the St. Croix.

Eckert Blufflands on the St. Croix - Hudson, WI ~ The new Eckert Blufflands County Park, along the St. Croix River just north of Hudson, consists of 170 acres of wooded upland, deep ravines, restored prairie, over 100-foot-high river bluffs, and more than half a mile of river shoreline. (Currently under development.)

St. Croix River Crossing Loop Trail - Houlton, WI ~ The Loop Trail is in Western St. Croix County, approximately seven miles north of Hudson and eight miles southwest of Somerset. The Loop Trail is part of an interstate trail between Houlton, Wisconsin and Stillwater, Minnesota. The 4.7-mile trail is open to pedestrians and bicycles and crosses both the St Croix Crossing Bridge and the historic Stillwater Lift Bridge.

POLK COUNTY PARKS

Apple River County Park & Campground - Amery, WI ~ A 20-acre park located along the Apple River north of Amery. The upper park includes 15 rustic camping sites with 5 electric sites, a picnic area with grills, playground, shelter with electric, vault toilets, and water fountain pump.

D. D. Kennedy Park - Amery, WI ~ A 99-acre environmental area preserve located between Amery and Balsam Lake along the Balsam Branch which flows through central Polk County. Located 17 minutes from St. Croix Falls. The park includes a prairie restoration area with hiking trails (interpretive) with native grasses, wildflowers, and birds, fishing (bridge and handicap accessible pier), dam and millpond, education building, picnic area with grills, picnic shelter with electric, playground, and restroom.



Hit the Trail

Lace up your hiking boots or walking shoes. With 7 state parks and more than 24 county and regional parks the St. Croix Valley has hundreds of trails that are perfect for all skill levels of hiking. **Some favorites include:**

Willow River State Park, WI

The park has 13 miles of hiking trails that vary in difficulty. The most popular hiking trail destination is Willow Falls and the scenic overlooks of the river valley.


Gandy Dancer Trail, WI

Amazing Places to Camp

If you are looking to escape city life, or just everyday life look no further than the St. Croix Valley's campgrounds and parks. From tent and car campsite areas in state and county parks and primitive and backwater campsites on national park land to private campgrounds and RV parks, here is just a glimpse of what some camping adventures can hold in the St. Croix Valley.

Interstate State Park, MN • Taylors Falls, MN

Located on the wild and scenic St. Croix River, Interstate Park has 63 total campsites. A large picnic area with covered shelter is adjacent to a 37 site campground. There are 4 group campsites, 37 drive in/RV campsites, 22 campsites with electricity available. The geology that formed this park intrigues visitors, at least 10 different lava flows are exposed in the park, along with two distinct glacial deposits, and traces of old streams, valleys and faults. During the summer, hike the trails and explore the glacial potholes that make this park unique. Canoe rental is located in the park and shuttle service is available.

William O'Brien State Park • Marine on St Croix, MN

The Park sits on the beautiful St. Croix River and is the perfect getaway to enjoy the outdoors. The park provides a number of opportunities to stay overnight, with 113 campsites, 4 group camps, and 4 camper cabins, 81 campsites with electrical hookups. The 12 miles of hiking trails offer quiet exploration of the park's rolling, wooded hills. In the winter, the trails are groomed for skiing and snowshoers can explore the Riverside Trail. Ideal for canoeing, the channels of the St. Croix are a favorite for anglers offering northerns, walleye, bass and trout.

Afton State Park • Hastings, MN

The 27 hike-in camping sites are located on the bluffs overlooking the St. Croix River, a strenuous 3/4 mile hike from the parking lot. The park also has 4 camper cabins, 3 yurts, and 2 group campsites, walk-in 1 site. Afton State Park's rugged, rolling landscape provides excellent hiking, horseback riding and skiing opportunities, plus a swimming beach and spectacular scenic overlooks of the St. Croix River. The park also has 5 miles of horseback trails.

Kinnickinnic State Park • River Falls, WI

Located south of Hudson, WI, the park offers an overlook of the sandy delta where the "kinni" river, a world-class trout stream, meets the St. Croix. Boat camping on the river is very popular as is the stretch of sandy beach.



St. Croix Bluffs Regional Park • Hastings, MN

The Park is a 579 acre regional park located on the wild and scenic St. Croix River. Facilities include a modern campground with 26 pull through RV sites (with water and 50 amp electric hook-ups), 36 drive in RV campsites, and tent camping sites (20-30 amp electric hook-ups). The campground also has a new accessible shower building. Pets are not permitted in the campground. A total of 10 miles of hiking trails offering loops and varied terrain.

Wild River State Park • Center City, MN

Located along 18 miles of the beautiful St. Croix River. The park provides opportunities for semi-modern camping, group camping, equestrian camping, backpack camping, and canoe camping. Visitors who want modern amenities can reserve the guest house which provides a living room, dining room, kitchen, and fireplace. The park also has six camping cabins which include bunk beds, a table, and benches.

Interstate State Park • St. Croix Falls, WI

Interstate Park is a popular place for camping, with two campgrounds and a primitive group camp. The north and south campgrounds have a total of 82 family campsites and two primitive, group campsites. The two group sites can accommodate a total of 60 people. Shower facilities are available in the north campground for registered campers.

Willow River State Park • Hudson, WI

A class 2 trout stream, sandy beach, prairie remnants and a nature center are featured on 2,891 acres of rolling countryside. 55 campsites with electrical hook ups, 12 group camping sites, 3 wheelchair accessible campsites. The park has spectacular views of the historic Willow Falls and the Willow River Gorge. Pets are welcome in Wisconsin State Parks but must be on a leash and under control at all times.



Cast Your Line

Clean water and a wide variety of underwater habitats are what makes the **Saint Croix National Scenic Riverway** support one of the best fisheries in the Upper Midwest. The St. Croix is abundant with fish, ranging from walleye, sauger, bass, crappie, Northern pike, muskie, carp, paddlefish, lake sturgeon and flathead catfish that'll give you a run for your life. There have been more than 60 species of fish documented from the St. Croix River.

The St Croix Valley's pan fish season never closes and walleye, northern pike and other seasons extend deep into winter. As a result, fishing continues to be one of the St. Croix Valley's most popular outdoor activities even long after the rivers and lakes have turned to ice.

The Kinnickinnic River, in River Falls, WI, is one of the most famous designated trout streams in the St. Croix Valley. The Kinni is also one of



the few naturally sustaining trout fisheries in the Midwest. The 22 mile spring fed river produces both brook and brown trout.

Enjoy the uniquely northern sport of ice fishing. Use your fishing rod all year with the ice fishing opportunities in Minnesota and Wisconsin state parks! Many parks also offer ice fishing events and hands-on programs to teach you how to ice fish.

Fishing Licenses: Fishing licenses are required in both Minnesota and Wisconsin for those ages 16+. They can be purchased at **Minnesota** (www.dnr.state.mn.us/licenses/agents.html) and **Wisconsin** (dnr.wisconsin.gov/topic/Fishing/outreach/FishingLicenses).



A Paddlers Paradise

The St. Croix River offers 169 miles of pristine paddling to its confluence with the Mississippi River near Prescott, WI. The upper St. Croix River flows past heavily wooded banks and islands while the lower St. Croix River showcases steep sandstone and limestone bluffs with winding side channels. Both sections of the river are perfect for canoeing and kayaking.

A popular paddling trip is the **St. Croix River State Water Trail**. Launch from Interstate Park Landing near Taylors Falls, MN and paddle 14.8 miles to William O' Brien State Park Landing. The trail is on the lower St. Croix, and is beautiful with its quiet tree-shaded backwaters. The route flows through a heavily wooded, steep-sided valley with occasional sandstone and limestone bluffs. Winding side channels and shaded backwaters offer opportunities for quiet exploration

and fishing. There are more than 11 free watercraft campsites along this route.

These campsites are available for overnight camping on a first-come, first-served basis. Most are reachable only by water.

Get in Gear for a Great Ride

One of the best ways to explore the St Croix River Valley is by bike. Pedal your way through the countless roads and trails throughout the Valley from the south at the confluence of the Mississippi and St. Croix Rivers to the north where you will find beautiful trails through serene woods.

In **Minnesota**, the **Gateway State Trail** is a paved 18 mile path from St. Paul to Pine Point Regional Park that branches into Stillwater via the **Brown's Creek State Trail**. From there you can ride the **St. Croix River Crossing Loop Trail**, a 4.7 mile trail that crosses the river on the historic Stillwater Lift Bridge, winds through Houlton and returns via the Stillwater Crossing interstate bridge. Minnesota is home to the **Swedish Immigrant Regional Trail** (22 miles), which runs from Taylors Falls, MN west to the town of Wyoming, MN.

For mountain biking head into **Wisconsin** to the **Woolly Bike Trails** in St. Croix Falls or the trails at **Willow River State Park**. Wisconsin offers rail trails like the **Stower Seven Lakes State Trail** (14 miles) and the **Cattail State Trail** (18 miles). Beginning at St. Croix Falls, WI the **Gandy Dancer Trail** stretches 47 miles through Wisconsin, 31 miles through Minnesota and another 15 miles back through Wisconsin before ending in Superior, WI.

The same pristine landscape that draws visitors to the St. Croix Valley also attracts 100's of species of birds throughout the year. Conservation efforts among the communities of the St. Croix Valley have garnered the Bird City designation by Bird City Minnesota and Wisconsin for the Wisconsin communities of Hudson, River Falls, Osceola, and Amery and Stillwater and Hastings in Minnesota.

Early morning and early evening hours are the quieter time along the river and in the wooded areas of the Valley and are an ideal time for a drive, hike, or paddle along one of the many area birding trails identified as Important Bird Areas (IBA) at www.birds.cornell.edu/landtrust/important-bird-areas.


Where the St. Croix Meets Old Man River



Visitors with a passion for architecture or history can stop in at the local Prescott Area Historical Society building and Information Center. It is housed in the 1885 Miller Bank building, listed on the National Registry of Historic Places. A prominent river town for decades, at the peak of the Steamboat era, Prescott averaged 20 steamboat landings per week. At the mouth of the St. Croix River over 9 billion board feet of logs and lumber passed through in a 75 year period.



A self-guided tour brochure of Prescott is available that will take you to 41 locations, including the original town square with several historic churches in the surrounding area. The tour also includes several 1850's and 1860's Greek revival homes, along with others built from 1890 to 1925 in the bluff top residential area.

Riverfront Recreation & Leisure

A walking tour of the riverfront is a popular choice, starting at the History Center and meandering along the river banks and including Mercord Mill Park, overlooking the confluence of the St. Croix and Mississippi Rivers. Enjoy the rivers while watching barges, boats, canoes, fishermen, and kayaks, and maybe an eagle or two. Rent a boat or pontoon and enjoy the two great rivers yourself. Enjoy fishing or a relaxing pleasure cruise. The local boat launch is readily accessible nearby for those who bring their own water craft.

You might even catch the distinctive iron railroad bridge built in 1983, named the Mickey Mouse bridge by local kids, rising to accommodate sailboats and other large vessels. 30 to 60 trains per day rumble through town for railroad buffs. The first railroad bridge to connect Minnesota and Wisconsin at Prescott was built in 1886, while the first car bridge opened in 1923.





The Eau Galle Dam and Recreation Area is the site of the Midwest's largest earthen dam. The Eau Galle reservoir is surrounded by nature areas, a public beach, boat launches, a 46 site campground with several miles of hiking and equestrian trails. Lake George is a modern man-made reservoir which boasts year round fishing. The Eau Galle River is also one of the best Class II trout streams in WI. Spring Valley is home to **Crystal Cave**, Wisconsin's longest cave. The bluff lands and river habitat of Lake Pepin provide a year-round home to song birds and raptors and the majestic American bald eagle. Migratory birds such as white pelicans, green herons, tundra swans and osprey make semi-annual stops in the Lake Pepin Area.

Get Hooked on Fishing

Lake Pepin is a popular fishery that is home to 85 species of fish including – Walleye, Northern Pike, Sauger, Smallmouth Bass, Crappie, Perch and Sunfish. Launch your boat from Pepin's public ramp and head for deep water, rocky shorelines, or weed cover to bag your catch. The launch area features a fully equipped fish cleaning station and public restrooms.



The City of Trails

In today's crazy, complex, gigabyte-per-second world, thank goodness we have our trails. Nothing virtual about this. Immerse your senses in the natural beauty as you run, walk, ski or ride your favorite trail in the St. Croix Falls network of trails. The **Ice Age Trail** highlights the effects of melting glaciers on the landscape. The 98 mile **Gandy Dancer Trail**, popular with hikers, cyclists, and cross-country skiers and snowmobilers, runs from St. Croix Falls north to Superior, WI.

Summer and fall, in the area, are perfect kayaking, canoeing, fishing, birding, and hiking. In the winter months enjoy downhill and cross-country skiing, snowshoeing, or fat tire biking.

Gateway to the Upper St. Croix Interstate Park is Wisconsin's oldest State Park and offers hiking, a swimming beach, boat launch, interpretive building, picnic area and camp sites. The park entrance is located just south of Highway 8, off of Highway 35, in St. Croix Falls. Located on the Wild & Scenic Riverway, the Park offers spectacular views of walled bluffs, deep valleys, forests, meadows, and wetlands. Abundant trails allow hikers of all abilities to explore glacial potholes. Bring your binoculars and catch sight of the incredible bird population that calls Interstate Park home. Make sure to explore the quaint downtown for unique shopping, dining, a fish hatchery, **Severson Memorial Overlook Park**, and the **Saint Croix National Scenic Riverway Visitor Center**.



Charming businesses, amazing outdoor recreation and exceptional places to eat make Taylors Falls a don't miss part of your St. Croix Valley experience.

Outdoor Activities

The Taylors Falls area is a hiker's dream, surrounded by bluffs and high cliffs. There's evidence of ancient lava flows and traces of old riverbeds. Perfect for exploring rocks, especially at **Interstate Park** along the scenic St. Croix River, founded in 1895 by Minnesota and Wisconsin.



A favorite hike is the 1.25-mile **Walter F. Mondale River Trail**, which traverses along the cliffs, and leads to several scenic overlooks along the St. Croix River. Don't miss the **Glacial Pothole Area** where fast moving whirlpools of swirling sand and water wore deep holes into the rock. You can see more than

400 examples of them in Taylors Falls – more than any other location in the world.

For fun on the water, rent a canoe or kayak and paddle the St. Croix. **Taylors Falls Canoe and Kayak Rental** is located

in Interstate State Park. No paddling experience is required. It's an easy stretch of the river, and there are plenty of sandy beaches where you can pull over and enjoy a picnic snack.

There are also scenic boat tours from Interstate Park that offer great views of the rocky cliffs along the river. The narrated tour points out rock formations all along the riverbanks, like the "Old Man of the Dalles". You might also spot rock climbers scaling the cliffs.



Shopping

To find a few local treasures from the area, hit the charming little shops right in downtown Taylors Falls.



If you're a fan of antiques, stroll through **River Alley Shoppes** to find vintage and repurposed goods. Makers will love finding new crafts at **Taylors Falls Bead Store** and shop local artists and artisan goods at **With August**.

Book lovers will adore **Sharp Reads** which holds shelves of new, used, and vintage finds on their shelves.

Food & Drink

The area's most iconic place to eat is **The Drive-in**, which serves burgers, sandwiches, fried foods, ice cream, and frosty mugs of house-made root beer. Order from your car and enjoy your meal in your vehicle or at a picnic table. Or, find artisan sandwiches and coffee drinks at **Juneberry Café**. Sip Minnesota-made wines at **Wild Mountain Winery**. This dog-friendly spot frequently has live music, wood-fired pizzas, cheese boards and a gift shop. For a special night out, make a reservation at **Tangled Up in Blue**, offering seafood, fresh-fish, hand-cut beef and decadent desserts.

Accommodations

Many campers flock to the area to stay in Interstate State Park or **Wildwood RV Park and Campground**. Hotels, motels, bed and breakfasts or vacation rentals are available in nearby **Chisago Lakes Area**.

The area is truly a gift of the glaciers – home to over 400 lakes, the **Saint Croix National Scenic Riverway**, two state parks and the western trailhead of the **Ice Age National Scenic Trail**.

Places of Splendor

Ice Age National Scenic Trail is one of only 11 National Scenic Trails located entirely within Wisconsin. Polk County is home to 62 miles of the Ice Age National Scenic Trail, a footpath that winds for more than a thousand miles across Wisconsin, following the edge of glaciation that shaped the state's terrain.

Saint Croix National Scenic Riverway - Extends 250 miles along both sides of the St. Croix and Namekagon Rivers. Primitive camping



Stower Seven Lakes Trail, a non-motorized 14-mile trail. The Stower Seven Lakes State Trail begins at Soo Line Park in **Amery** and ends at Lotus Lake County Park about 1 mile from **Dresser**. The 98-mile **Gandy Dancer Trail** follows the old Minneapolis-St. Paul and Sault Ste. Marie railroad grade, from St. Croix Falls to Superior, WI. In Polk County, the trail passes through Centuria, Milltown, Luck, Frederic and Lewis, WI. The short distances between these quaint towns makes the Gandy Dancer one of the most user friendly trails in the Midwest with easy access to local restaurants, lodging, parking and other local scenic trails and parks.

Spend time exploring **Straight Lake Wilderness State Park** Wisconsin's newest state park and **Straight River Wildlife Area**, just 12 miles northeast of St. Croix Falls. The park is an easy day trip and the scenery and wildlife are worth the time. The **Village of Luck** is just 3 miles away.



Wisconsin Interstate State Park The oldest state park in Wisconsin with unique geology found nowhere else. One of the few parks with year-round camping on the St. Croix River, some handicap accessible campsites, picnic shelters, scenic overlooks, a swimming beach, boat access, and shore fishing. Enjoy winter hiking, snowshoeing and cross-country ski trails. Open year-round.

Balsam Lake – Where it's Naturally Fun

The community of Balsam Lake sits on the beautiful shores of its namesake Balsam Lake. The 2,000 acre lake is dotted with islands and bays and renowned for its superb bass fishing. Established in 1905, Balsam Lake has a rich history and is a very popular tourism location. Whether you are looking for a quiet place to relax or take part in a variety of activities both on and off shore, Balsam Lake is the place to visit. Just minutes away are golf courses, casinos, antique and boutique shopping, a water park and downhill skiing. Some of northwest Wisconsin's favorite trails pass through Balsam Lake, offering opportunities for cross-country skiing, hiking, snowshoeing, ATVing and snowmobiling.

Clear Lake – Small Town Charm, Big City Spirit

The Village of Clear Lake is named after the lake just outside of downtown. The lake's water is supplied from living springs, making it both a great fishing and swimming lake with a clean and inviting sand beach. The lake is near two other lakes in a 260-acre park with a playground, picnic shelters, softball field, and modern campsites, which accommodate tents, campers and RV's. Clear Lake is the trailhead of a multi-use trail for recreational vehicles, snowmobiles, bicycling, hiking and cross-country-skiing.

The **Clear Lake Museum** features hometown heroes Senator Gaylord Nelson, the former governor and founder of Earth Day, and Burleigh Grimes, National Baseball League Hall of Famer, in addition to hundreds of other priceless artifacts.

Visitors will enjoy several celebrations hosted in Clear Lake throughout the year, including **Kick off to summer, Heritage Days** and a **New Year's Eve fireworks show**. Enjoy four seasons of fun in Clear Lake – from fishing, to power sports, camping, and outdoor recreation or just relaxing on the beach.

Turtle Lake – Rural Beauty plus Native Traditions

Refresh and energize your inner spirit with a visit to Turtle Lake, home to the St. Croix Band of Chippewa Indians and Turtle Lake Casino. St. Croix Falls prospered during the lumbering era that relied on the St. Croix River to move logs downstream. Historic **Amery** sits on an isthmus between the Apple River and Pike,

North Twin, and South Twin Lakes. **Osceola** is overflowing with rich history and a beautiful historical downtown main street, complete with a waterfall! The **Villages of Polk County** including **Centuria, Frederic, Luck, Cushing, Milltown, Clayton** and **Dresser** may be small but are big on hometown friendliness and each has a special festival, trail or other surprise you will not want to miss.



Polk County Arts & Culture

Art unlocks our imagination, makes life richer and brings us to life. So live life to its fullest with a visit to Polk County's art galleries and theaters. **St. Croix Art Barn** is a bi-state community arts organization. Guilds include theater, visual arts, music, writing and dance. Annual events include – a concert series, bluegrass festival, garden tour and art classes. Your Polk County art adventure won't be complete without a visit to **artZ Gallery** in Amery, **Café Wren** in Luck, and **One 10 Gallery** in Frederic.

Performing Arts

That is what audiences have come to expect from the St. Croix Festival Theatre as they bring professional actors, directors, and designers from all across the country to the St. Croix Valley each year.
